The following updates have been made to the MIAX Futures Rulebook, effective for the July 24, 2026 trade date:

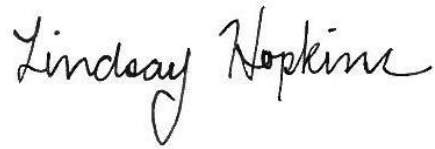
Chapter	Citation	Purpose
1	Definitions	Added defined term “Railroad National Tariffs” and included a delivery failure in the definition of Clearing Member Default.
3	3.1.8.	Rule amended to align with the change in deliverable instrument against commodity futures from warehouse receipts to shipping certificates.
50	Chapter 50	Chapter 50 Minneapolis Hard Red Spring Wheat (“HRSW”) Futures amended to align with changes to contract specifications, including the addition of an interior delivery point; addition of a falling number; addition of country of origin requirement; and removal of the federal appeal process regarding first official grade. Chapter also amended to align with the change in deliverable instrument against Minneapolis HRSW futures from warehouse receipts to shipping certificates. Chapter also amended to align with MIAX Futures facilitating delivery payments through its Clearing House.
52	52.1., 52.2., 52.4., 52.5.	Rule amended to account for the new interior delivery point and the change in deliverable instrument against Minneapolis HRSW Futures from warehouse receipts to shipping certificates.
72	Resolution 2101.00.C.	Reporting deadlines amended to include delivery payment, delivery of shipping certificates, notification of delivery failure, and registration and cancellation of shipping certificates.
